**Orange County Property Appraiser (OCPA) Extends Deadline
For Income & Expense Surveys For Commercial Property**

~Essential Document Provided by Business Owners is Now Due May 29, 2020 ~

Orlando, FL – More relief for Orange County business owners. In light of the challenges facing the community due to the Coronavirus, Orange County Property Appraiser Rick Singh announced today that **Income & Expense Surveys** – an important document used in the process to determine assessments of commercial properties – will now be due on May 29, 2020. This is essentially a six-week extension, from the standard mid-April deadline.

“This is a challenging time for commercial property owners,” said Singh. “Things are changing daily and none of us is sure when we will return to ‘normal.’ We want to help Orange County taxpayers with additional time to meet deadlines, so they can deal with more immediate challenges first.”

There is no need to apply for the extension – it will be automatically granted to all filers. **Income & Expense Surveys** can be filed online or via US mail. For 2020, they can also be filed via email to fluciano@ocpaf.org. Additional information is available on the OCPA website at www.ocpaf.org. Property owners with questions can call the OCPA **Income & Expense Survey** Line at (407) 836-5978 during regular business hours. Despite the office being closed to visitors due to the corona virus, the phones are available Monday – Friday from 8 am to 5 pm.
